Instructions For Making A Quilt Sleeve

METHOD 1

- 1. Cut a piece of fabric 13" wide and a length that is 5" less than the width of the quilt (to finish within the edges of the quilt at both sides).
- 2. Fold under a ½" hem on each narrow end of fabric and sew.
- Fold sleeve in half lengthwise, wrong sides together, and sew a ½" seam.
- 4. Turn sleeve right side out and press so seam is in the middle at the back. Hand sew the long side of the sleeve at the top of the quilt, next to the binding.
- 5. Make a fold in the sleeve to allow room for the pole to go through and then sew the bottom edge of the sleeve to the quilt.

METHOD 2

- 1. Cut a piece of fabric 8" wide and a length that is 5" less than the width of the quilt (to finish within the edges of the quilt at both sides).
- 2. Fold under a ½" hem on each narrow end of the fabric and sew.
- 3. Fold under a 1" hem on each long side of the fabric and sew.
- Hand sew the long side of the sleeve at the top of the quilt, next to the binding.
- 5. Make a fold in the sleeve to allow room for the pole to go through and then sew the bottom edge of the sleeve to the quilt.

NOTE: Quilt sleeves may be sewn OR pinned on.

Sleeves MUST be at least 6" deep!
